WA Country Health Services, Hedland Health Campus Work Experience








We look forward to hearing the pathways these students choose to take post school, whether it be Employment, Apprenticeships, Traineeships and or Tertiary Studies.



















































































Year 12 Work Ready Program Farewell.





Yr 10 Town of Port Hedland Career Taster


On Friday 29th August, a group of Year 10 students spent the day visiting various Town of Port Hedland sites to gain an insight into the large range of careers available in local government.
